OBTAINING MEDICAL DOCUMENTS

When you leave foster care the county is required to help you obtain your medical and dental records AND a contact list of your medical, dental, and mental health providers.

Be sure to ask your social worker for help in obtaining these important documents!

Provides low-cost, sexuality-related health care, health education, counseling and outreach to adolescents in North and Northeast Minneapolis and Northwest suburban Hennepin County. All services are confidential and are offered free or on a sliding fee scale.

Face to Face Health Care

Youth ages 11-23 can receive counseling services, general medical and reproductive health care at the Face to Face Clinic located in St. Paul. Face to Face accepts most insurance plans, including medical assistance. Youth without insurance will only be charged what they can afford to pay.
